ABOUT BE MORE CHILL

Jeremy Heere is just an average teenager.

Downloads porn. Has poor hygiene. A bit of a loser.

That is, until Jeremy discovers THE SQUIP - a supercomputer inside a tiny grey pill he swallows with *Mountain Dew* that promises him EVERYTHING he desires. Girls. Popularity. Being. More. Chill.

It's just your typical science fiction pop-rock love story. Guy likes Girl, Girl likes theatre, Guy installs evil computer chip in his brain and deletes everything important to him in exchange for popularity... with zombies!

Based on the young adult novel of the same name by *Ned Vizzini*, *BE MORE CHILL* is the new musical sensation that's about to invade your brain in the best way... An unprecedented international phenomenon, this original and hilarious show uploaded to the musical theatre scene and electrified audiences during its runs off- and on Broadway.

According to The New Yorker, "If you fed 'Dear Evan Hansen' and 'Mean Girls' to the 'Little Shop of Horrors' plant, you'd get **BE MORE CHILL**."

CASTING INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS

- All members of the **BE MORE CHILL** cast must be 16 years or older at the time of auditions. Applicants turning 16 within the rehearsal period may apply for consideration.
- BE MORE CHILL explores sensitive themes such as teenage suicide, depression, underage
 drinking, sex & drug use. However, the production is overall an uplifting and empowering
 piece for actors & audiences.
- Previous experience and looks/appearance may be considered in addition to audition performance in casting decisions.
- The cast for BE MORE CHILL will be capped at 25 people in total.
 The production team reserves the right to revise that number at the time of casting.
- Applicants under the age of 18 at the time of auditions may audition for a character, however the casting panel expects to cast lead roles with older applicants. Exceptional performers under 18 may be considered against adults.
- This production has a very short rehearsal period. The casting panel will be looking for hard working, reliable applicants.
- A range of shapes and sizes is desired for all roles.

AUDITION PROCESS

All individuals auditioning for **BE MORE CHILL** will be required to complete a singing and dance audition. Applicants wishing to audition for a principal role will be required to also complete a set reading.

The information below outlines both the expectations of the production team and the requirements for each facet of the audition process.

SINGING AUDITION

A pianist will be available on the day. It is expected that applicants have prepared the provided audition piece. Please do not include choreography as part of your vocal audition but feel free to express your selected character through facial expressions and body language.

Specific audition pieces have been selected from **BE MORE CHILL**.

Please refer to the audition song list available on page 8.

DANCE AUDITION

There is nothing to prepare in advance. The choreographer will set and then drill a short routine. Whilst assessing technique and current ability, a willingness to learn will also be an important element in the audition. The dance audition itself will then be performed in small groups. Please wear appropriate, non-restrictive clothing.

READING AUDITION

Applicants auditioning for any spoken role will need to prepare a short dialogue excerpt from the production. Readings will be available in digital format on The Regals website after orientation. While performers are not required to memorise the script, it is expected that they have prepared the piece and carefully considered/developed the character they are auditioning for.

You may be reading opposite a member of the casting panel. Be prepared to receive direction during your audition. This may mean that some readings will be cut short.

Any applicant applying for an ensemble position does not need to prepare a reading. However, please be aware that the audition panel may ask you to present a cold read on the day selected from the readings available.

CALLBACKS

Applicants required for a callback will be contacted in advance of Wednesday, December 4 and provided with any material they need to prepare in advance. It is possible that not all actors being considered for a role will be invited to callbacks.

RESULTS

Successful principal characters will be contacted via phone prior to the announcement. All cast will be posted on our website www.theregals.com.au

ABOUT AUDITIONS & HOW TO BOOK

Auditions will be held at Carlton Public School from Wednesday, November 20. Bookings for auditions will open at the Orientation on Wednesday, November 6.

The production team requires a headshot from all applicants wishing to be considered for any role. This can be sent digitally with your initial email or printed and brought with you on the day. Headshots will be used as part of the casting process, applicants without a provided headshot will be at a disadvantage. They can be a black and white print out on paper.

When emailing to book an audition please include:

- Auditionee Name
- Auditionee Age / DOB
- Contact Number
- The role(s) you wish to audition for
- A headshot
- A first and second preference for date and time

We will reply with an audition time within 24 hours.

Bookings for Monday, December 2 will not become available until all other dates are exhausted.

Please note, any applicant turning 16 during the rehearsal period may not be successful in securing an audition spot. Please allow at least 48 hours for review.

Ensemble

Ensemble work for this production is busy, with over 10 major choreographed numbers and multiple opportunities to showcase devised character moments.

Aside from key principal characters, cast will be required to learn all musical numbers and be prepared to sing side stage if required.

A NOTE ON ADULT THEMES

While this production has an overall bubbly/upbeat tone...

Please note the following:

- The choreography and/or blocking may be sexually suggestive
- There may be stage kissing (actors 18+)
- There is explicit underage drinking in one scene
- Characters in the play state that they use marijuana
- Characters in the play imply they are sexually active
- Characters in the play use explicit language
- The main character swallows a pill onstage, and others willingly follow
- One character is held down by an adult and forced to take a pill

If you are not comfortable with some of these notes, **BE MORE CHILL** may not be a production you can be comfortable performing in.

The production team would like to know from any cast member if you are not comfortable with the following:

- Stage kissing (for over 18s)
- Physical contact during sexually suggestive scenes/choreography

The production team are prepared to work around the needs of any successful applicants.

If you audition well and we want to include you in the show this enables us to work around your commitments when arranging the schedule.

- Cast must commit to ALL scheduled rehearsals.
- Unavoidable exceptions can be communicated via your Audition application form.
- A closed Facebook group will be the primary form of communications.
- The Regals Musical Society Inc reserves the right to replace any performer who misses or is significantly late for three rehearsals or shows without a satisfactory explanation.
- The Regals Musical Society Inc also reserves the right to replace any performer who accepts a role in another production or becomes involved in another event or activity which negatively affects their attendance and ability during the rehearsal schedule or show season.
- All members are required to adhere to The Regals' Code of Conduct (act responsibly, respectfully and co-operatively), and obey the rules as set down by our Constitution. A copy of the Constitution can be requested from the Regals' Secretary; secretary@theregals.com.au
- THE CAST AND THEIR FAMILIES ARE EXPECTED TO ASSIST in promoting the show, contributing to props, participating in front-of-house, foyer decoration, bump in and bump out, and other activities
- You may need to supply stage make-up and provide items of clothing/accessories for costumes
- Professional photos, and videos, may be taken for the show program and publicity. Your acceptance of a
 role in the cast indicates your consent to this photography and videography.

FEES

All cast members will be asked to pay a flat Show Fee of \$120 which will cover the cast member's Regals Musical Society Membership, the Show Levy, a commemorative program.

The Show Levy assists the Society with society insurance and the incurred cost of production (licensing, rehearsal materials, costumes, props, lighting, sound, set supplies etc).

The Show Fee MUST be paid by December 18th 2019

You will also need to provide your own stage make-up and may be asked to provide certain items of clothing for costumes
